# Membership-

- Price increase letters will be going out soon as they need to give the members a 60-day notice of a price increase which will be a 3.5% increase.
- Year to date they have a net of 94 and the goal was net 10
- Courts Plus will discontinue using the company In-House for social media campaigns and start using Fargo Parks marketing department for this. In-House will be used for ad purchasing and placement.

## Programing:

#### Tennis and Pickleball-

# Course Reports:

Edgewood and El Zagal- Greg McCullough

- Late start to the season this year
- El Zagal had the most players this year since 2000
- Kudos to the superintendents for all their work this season

## Jason reported

- No major issues throughout the season
- Vandalism at El Zagal this season and about 26 flagsticks stolen or damaged and some damage to greens
- Had a great crew but a little short on staff toward the end of season now
- Will be hiring a new assistant since Lucas Palczewski has left for another position

Commissioner Morgan asked if the vandalism was the same at all courses. This only happened at El Zagal. Originally there was fence around El Zagal but due to FEMA and the dike, that is not allowed any longer.

## Rose Creek and Prairiewood- Matt Cook

- 2022 very successful year
- Over 60,000 rounds for the 2<sup>nd</sup> straight year
- Leagues and club activities produce amazing numbers
- Staff was a struggle; retention has been good but getting new applicants has been tough
- Surpass 32,500 rounds at Rose Creek and 27,500 at Prairiewood

Commissioner Hill asked about the average pace of play, and it's been really good, and they shoot for 4.5 hours and 90-95% of the time they beat that. now have 10-minute tee times so the courses are not jammed up.

Commissioner Morgan asked about Prairiewood and being under-utilized, and it is more of a plain course compared to the others. Matt responded that many people really enjoy this course and a very busy course. There are more opportunities moving forward.

Legends at Rose Creek will be closing at the end of this week. Staff will be looking at finding a new vendor.

Eric reported (via Dave Bietz)

- Seasonal staffing was a struggle this year
- Hole 13 under water for about five days
- Rose Creek, between holes 8 and 9, the staff is trying a revitalization project with pollinator planting and prairie grass planting so staff will no longer need to maintain the area,

# Ryan Stalboerger Reported: (via Dave Bietz)

- Osgood had a great year with over 32,000 rounds
- We opened on May 4th.
- My team and my assistant Zach Foltz did an amazing job keeping Osgood looking exceptional all season
- It was the first year as I am the Superintendent and Zach Foltz being my 1st assistant and Chris Larson being the Head Pro
- We finished the Driving Range Mats project on June 16th.
- We did a drain tile project on hole #2 this summer and are planning on doing more drain tile projects on hole #4, #7 and the driving range this fall
- Thank you to the Parks Maintenance Dept on their help with covers, aerification and putting in and taking out our river pump this season
- Blowing out our Irrigation on October 24th-26th due to the Faults construction on hole #6. Normally we would have blown out on Oct 10th-12th.
- The Faults project started on September 26th on Hole #6. And the second phase of the Faults project starts on October 17th on hole #8
- We closed on October 16

# Construction Projects-

# Osgood-

- The Osgood slope stability project is about halfway completed. They have finished hole 6 and started on hole 8 and should wrap up in the next couple of weeks.
- In 2023 at Osgood is an irrigation update. The current system is no longer being supported. They will have new decoders on each head.

#### Rose Creek-

- At Rose Creek the tunnel lid where the carts are stored was going to be refreshed, but there was an issue with the contractor losing all his help so this will be pushed until next year.
- There is an HVAC project going on to convert all the roof top units over to natural gas. This should be wrapped up by the third week in November.
- Just started a cart path project on hole 5 which is part of our 2022 concrete project

## Edgewood for 2023-

- Driving Range Tee
- Cart path work
- Irrigation replacement planning and permitting to continue.

#### Season Pass Sales-

Spring and Summer 2022

- Modified season due to hiring constraints
- Great spring/summer season
- North complex did not open this year
- Hired a younger staff

The ballfields did well even though the North Complex was closed. Total for 2022 was \$69,478.50 and in 2021 the total was \$70,531.50.

With the pools we had to cut back and only have concessions at the Davies pool, and vending machines at the other three pools.

Going into the end of 2022 and 2023 we just hired a FT concession coordinator with another position open and will now have 3 full-time staff in the concession department.
