Spring Youth Programs and Activities

- Swimming Lessons We offered two spring sessions of lessons at Fargo South Indoor Pool. We had 194 registrants for the two sessions (40 more than last spring) and 24 on the waitlist
- Volleyball We offered a 5th and 6th grade girls VB league. 29 girls played on three teams at Clara Barton school gym. (down 6 from last year)
- Sports Sampler Two spring courses were offered for a total of 33 registrants.
 Up from last year
- Art classes All art classes were full. (12 per class)
- o Adaptive Tae Kwon Do numbers have grown a little bit but holding steady
- Youth Climbing This was the second time we offered the program and it did very well. Doubled our numbers for the Spring session. About 30 youth participated

Spring Adult Programs and Activities

- o Adult Volleyball We had around 150 teams this Spring. All went well.
- 3-on-3 Basketball We had 24 teams play in two divisions on Sundays at Fargo North High School.
- Art classes The adaptive art classes were full each day we had them.
 (12 per class)

Summer Youth Programs and Activities

- Swimming Lessons We offered morning lessons at Fargo South and Fargo North Indoor pools and evening lessons at Madison Pool. We had 692 total registrants (40 more than last summer). Lessons were held (Mon – Thur.) for two weeks.
 We had no problem finding instructors this summer. There is plenty of demand for lessons.
- Sports Sampler We offered morning and evening classes at Lindenwood. We offer two summer sessions. There was a total of 135 registered in the morning

- sessions (down from last summer) and 75 (15 more than last year) in the evening sessions.
- Youth Girls Volleyball Camp- It was held at Sports Arena first week of June Monday-Thursday. We had 43 registrants (double last year) and it went well. It was very hot in the arena during the day that week.
- Youth Coed Sand Volleyball Camp- It was held outside at Rabanus the second week of August. We had 34 registrants (double last year). It was a good camp!
- Track and Field The older group (8-12) were at full capacity. The younger group (5-7) had room for about 10 more. The season went very well except for it was a very hot June.
- Youth Baseball/T-Ball We were up somewhat in number compared to 2022. All went well. We had no rainouts but unfortunately it was a very hot Summer.
- Youth Golf Well over 700 participants in this program. All 5 courses were used during this Summer's golf program. The golf pros will be taking over this program in 2024!
- Play town Great summer, had very good staff and numbers are strong.
- O Adaptive Tae Kwon Do numbers have grown a little bit but holding steady.
- Art classes All our Summer art classes we at max capacity. (12 per class)

Summer Adult Programs and Activities

- Sand Volleyball We had about 130 teams that participated in this program.
- Coed Softball Continued with the partnership with Fargo USA Softball to have umpires. Tuesday and Thursday evenings went well with 13 teams each night.
- Kickball Our registration grew to 8 teams. Great time with the teams this season.
- Adaptive Softball Ran great, we did have to cancel more this summer due to heat but all groups seemed very happy with season.
- MS Group Continues to run well, the participants enjoy getting together each week.

Facility Scheduling

Campground reservations were offered online this year. Approximately 1200 reservations were made online which is about 50% of reservations. We are hoping that number will grow next year now that people are aware they can reserve online.

Pool parties at Davies and Southwest Rec pools were added to our online reservations this season.

Lindenwood has 3 new small shelters this season.

Rheault Farm had 14 full-site rentals in 2023. The bunkhouse at Rheault Farm had 16 rentals. These are both up significantly from last year.

Staff

 We Hired a total of 148 staff between lifeguards, management, cashiers, concessions, and swimming lesson instructors. We did not have a hard time finding staff this year since Island Park was closed. It is always hard finding staff to work through Labor Day weekend as school starts.

- What we pay to keep Davies open the extra week/weekends
 - o Total hours: 1067.5
 - Time and Half Pay: \$27,221.25 (includes management, concessions, guards with an average of \$17/hour)
 - o We made about \$21,000 in admission and concessions.

Future

• We are working on putting together future aquatic recommendations for the Fargo Park District that include more spray-grounds in our area.
